Abstract

The diploma thesis "Biblical view of God's calling to creation from the beginning to fulfillment" explores the phenomenon of creation and God's purpose with it. This purpose is formulated as a calling in this thesis and is reduced to the area of communion between God and human. With the help of of biblical resource the thesis offers the image of God as a Creator, presents his creative activity and especially the relationship between the Creator and the creation.

It begins with the section of Gen 1–3, where the thesis tries to find out whether there are any traces of God's calling towards communion with Him addressed to human. The image of creation in Gen 1–3 is supplemented with the overall view of the phenomenon of creation in the other books of OT and NT. Besides Gen 1–3 substantial importance is attributed to places dealing with the new creation (New Jerusalem) in Rev 21–22. The thesis tries to answer the question whether it is possible to perceive the new creation as a fulfillment of God's calling to communion human with God. The important part of the work is the comparison of related places, the treatise on the theological topics and its corresponding conclusions, where the emphasis is placed on the connection of OT and NT and the overlap of NT.
