## **Abstract**

Thesis Burnout syndrome amowg social workers in residental service deals with the issue of burnout as such. It focuses on the definition of the term as well as its development. So are related phenomena - stress, depression, fatigue, but also existential neurosis. It also mentions internal and external influences, which can often be the cause of burnout, as well as high-risk persons - ie the most risky types of personality as well as professions who often fall victim to burnout.
