

Summary

In my diploma thesis I focus on assertive care for people with mental illness, which is a comprehensive service in the field. The term "assertive care" refers to the ways in which professional care is provided, which is characterized by the fact that it takes place in the community and that it also includes, to a certain extent, taking responsibility for the person. I think about man and human dignity and what the respect for man means. I deal with the basic concepts of man as a helping worker and a person who draws help. The focus of my work is the description of approaches to man, which focus primarily on man in his uniqueness with his specific wishes and needs in life.
