The Women's Decameron, a legitimation of women's authorship

Report

The dissertation by Valentina Bagozzi focuses on Julia Voznesenskaya's noteworthy text *The Women's Decameron*, which definitely deserves the attention of literary scholars. Bagozzi fits her textual analysis into the framework of Russian women's writing and into the context of feminist interpretation. Probably the major contribution of this thesis can be found in the publication of archival materials from the funds of Julia Voznesenskaya at the Research Centre for East European Studies at the University of Bremen, which are used by Bagozzi in her interpretation and history of the different variants of the text of *The Women's Decameron*.?The current revised version of the dissertation has much clearer structure compared to the previous version, however, in some parts the connection and logical sequence is still not very comprehensible. In some cases, especially in the introductory part, the thesis lacks the support of relevant scientific literature or examples (e.g. on p. 4: Scholars interested in Russian women's writing encourage a systematic investigation of the phenomenon and the discovery of previously neglected literary works by combining the authors' biographical research and close readings of their texts (with no reference).

On the other hand, I greatly appreciate the author's emphasis on context, and in particular, on the discussion of women's prose in the context of Russian literary criticism. ?In terms of language, the author has failed to avoid the overuse of the Saxon genitive (e.g. p. 15 - Russian literary criticism's double standards, the impact of the nineteenth century's category, p. 16 - women's writing's historical periods, p. 17 - evolution of patriarchal discourse's influence), which unfortunately often complicates the understanding of a given text.

However, in general, the thesis is of a good standard and I recommend it for defence. On the other hand, I greatly appreciate the author's emphasis on context, and in particular, on the discussion of women's prose in the context of Russian literary criticism.
