Abstract

The diploma thesis presents a selected part of the fundamental theology of two important fundamental theologians of the 20th century: Avery Dulles and Gerald O'Collins. The first part of the work introduces the overall context of thinking (life and work) of both theologians. The next part will focus on the analysis of specific theological studies, that deal with the concept of revelation, I will focus mainly on Dulles's books *Revelation Theology: A History, Models of Revelation* and primary O'Collins texts on the topic: *Fundamental Theology, Rethinking Fundamental Theology, Revelation*. I will try to describe the essential features of their understanding of the concept and models of revelation and compare the advantages and limits of both theological perspectives.
