The master's thesis, "Religious Extremism – From the Perspective of Danger to Society and State" provides a comprehensive look at and characterizes the global problem of extremism, with a particular focus on terrorism in connection with religious groups operating primarily in the Czech Republic after 1989.

The first part maps out the extremist scene in the Czech Republic and identifies within it the position of religions defined as extremist. The second part discusses religious extremism and focuses on the dangerous sectarian discourses and manifestations of some religious movements and communities as a danger to individuals and the broader environment. The third part deals with the most radical form of extremism - terrorism - as the most serious security threat to society and state.
