The Carving Family Bušek of Husa near Sychrov

The carving Bušek workshop started his activity in the first half of 19th century. In 1856 moved the founder of the workshop Petr Bušek in Sychrov, to make the carving furniture and room decorations for the Prince Kamil Rohan's neogothic Castle Sychrov. From 1880's, when both Petr's sons – Dominik and Konstantin had already worked in the workshop, new commissions for the production of ecclesiastical furnishings started to increase. After Petr Bušek's death in 1894 this workshop produced above-all the church furniture. The activity of Bušek workshop finished with the start of the First World War. In this bachelor thesis is take down not only the history of the carwing workshop Bušek, but also their fundamental works.
